Long-Term Outcomes

Securing affordable rental housing reduces housing instability, overcrowding and the chance of facing homelessness.

Having a safe and affordable place to live increases residents' financial security and reduces poverty. Housing affordability lowers rental cost burdens, helps people remain employed, secure health care and build savings.

Well-constructed and well-maintained rental housing can reduce asthma and other respiratory illnesses by decreasing exposure to health hazards like mold, lead and pests. A study in **Greensboro** found that housing interventions for children living in homes with asthma triggers lowered their hospital bills by 50%.

Building safe, high-quality affordable apartments revitalizes low- and moderate-income neighborhoods by lowering crime rates and boosting home prices by <u>6.5%</u> on average.
