I spoke with Sandy Harris earlier this week and asked her about the possibility of expanding the number of accessible units in each new property or adding walk in showers in more units. I monitor the state's Olmstead Settlement Agreement and see first hand the number of individuals with chronic medical conditions and or physical disabilities. In the past year, 84% of individuals we reviewed had at least one physical disabilty or chronic medical condition. At least half of the people we reviewed had two or more of these. Over 70% of the people we have reviewed were between the ages of 30 and 60. Since we began reviews we have reviewed a 15% sample of 9,000 people and have seen this percentage increase over time. I am more than happy to discuss these issues if helpful.
