Long-Term Outcomes

Securing affordable rental housing reduces housing instability, <u>overcrowding</u> and the chance of facing homelessness.

Access to safe and affordable housing is closely linked to individuals' <u>physical and</u> <u>mental health</u>. Living in affordable housing prevents persistently high levels of stress, which often leads to mental health and substance use problems.

Well-constructed and well-maintained rental housing can reduce asthma and other respiratory illnesses by decreasing exposure to health hazards like <u>mold</u>, lead and pests. A study in <u>Greensboro</u> found that housing interventions for children living in homes with asthma triggers lowered their hospital bills by 50%.

Building safe, high-quality affordable apartments revitalizes low- and moderate-income neighborhoods by lowering crime rates and boosting home prices by <u>6.5%</u> on average.
